Singapore, Saturday, 13 October 2018. In celebration of Bulan Bahasa (Malay Language Month)

2018, PPIS Early Childhood Education (ECE) organised their their first ever Karnival Bahasa Melayu

with Guest-of-Honour Associate Professor Dr Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim, Senior Parliamentary

Secretary for Ministry of Social and Family Development and Ministry of Education at the Park

Avenue Convention Centre today.

Some 450 participants consisting of Kindergarten 1 students from seven PPIS ECE centres, family

members and friends attended the half-day language carnival. They were entertained by students'

performances of Malay folk songs while wearing their traditional wear, and various activity booths

on Malay language and culture, such batik painting, tanjak (Malay headress) making and storytelling

by SG Ulat Buku.

Initially a pilot programme by PPIS ECE centre in Bukit Batok, the Karnival was a collective effort of

all the PPIS ECE centres who acknowledged the importance of their Mother Tongue.

PPIS ECE hopes that this will not only encourage students to speak Malay outside of the classroom,

hence improving their speaking abilities, but also urge family members and friends to start instilling

the language at home. Activity booths were also intended to provide a holistic approach and further

develop the students' interests in Malay history and culture.

Furthermore, the Early Childhood Development Agency (ECDA) and the National Institute of Early

Childhood Development (NIEC) recently introduced a new specialised Certificate in Preschool

Mother Tongue Language Teaching, providing Mother Tongue language courses for preschool

teachers. This is very much in line with PPIS' aspirations of becoming the leader in preschool Malay

Language teaching in Singapore, and to always seek opportunities to provide quality education.
